New research priorities for the Society have been defined. The MSTs Mentored Research and Scholar Program Award is being launched. Details on these initiatives can be found on the MSTs website (www.msts.org).

The National Orthopaedic Leadership Conference (NOLC) held in Washington, June 6-8, 2018 is the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS) premier advocacy event where participants meet with their congressmen/women and discuss key issues related to Orthopaedics. This year, the MSTs was represented by Dr's. Michael Mott, Robert Quinn, Joel Mayerson, Theodore Parsons and Joseph Benevenia.

Dr. Valerae O. Lewis and the Education Committee have completed the "Online Pathology Course" along with other successful AAOS ICL'S Symposia and Scientific exhibits.

Dr. Adam Levin and the Practice Management Committee continue to protect and advance our interests in the billing/coding world. New allograft codes have been approved by the American Medical Association Relative Value Scale Update Committee (RUC). 



National Orthopaedic Leadership Conference

The AAOS held its National Orthopaedic Leadership Council meeting in Washington, DC, June 6-9, 2018. Advocacy for “House of Orthopaedics” is always the focus of this annual event. During the Capitol Hill visits on Thursday, June 7, our elected officials and, or, their staff were presented with the AAOS positions on:

1. Opioid drug use, misuse, and abuse legislation. Additionally, the AAOS prescription safety campaign public service announcement was given as a leave behind.
2. Support for the “Good Samaritan Health Professionals Act” at the federal level.
3. Regulatory relief for Coordinated Care and a thank you for repeal of the Independent Payment Advisory Board (IPAB).

The next two days included six sessions outlining sessions on:

1. Orthopaedic Affiliates- who should the AAOS reach out to affiliate with and “What to expect when you’re electing”- discussing key candidates in the next national election cycle.
2. AAOS leadership update- A question and answer session with the AAOS Presidential Line.
3. Blurred Lines- a session discussing inappropriate workplace behaviors.
4. Youth and Tomorrow’s leaders- a discussion on mentoring and leadership opportunities.

5. Payment models where different payment systems in the US and Canada were discussed
6. Disaster Relief Orthopaedics Here and Abroad- a discussion about the need to for vigilance and preparedness for disasters and the important role the orthopaedic community plays during these events.

Lastly, a number of advisory opinions were voted upon for the AAOS Executive Committee to consider moving forward including opinions on joint registry, GRADE methodology for clinical practice guidelines, opposition to recognizing the shoulder as one anatomic site, a firearm public safety statement, prescription drug monitoring for methadone, and support for expansion of resources for hospital employed orthopaedic surgeons.

Evidence Based Medicine Committee

The Evidence Based Medicine (EBM) Committee has completed our first clinical practice guideline “The use of imaging prior to referral to a musculoskeletal oncologist.” It is currently available on the MSTS website (under the “Education and Meetings” tab). This guideline has been adopted by the AAOS and will soon be available on Ortho Guidelines – please help us diffuse the results of this effort by promoting the document and information therein to referring providers, trainees, and cancer colleagues!

The appropriate use criteria “Surveillance of local recurrence and distant metastasis after surgical treatment of bone and soft tissue sarcoma” (PI Dr. Raj Rajani) is in its final version and awaiting approval by the MSTS and AAOS. There was great support and participation by members of the MSTS, AAOS, Connective Tissue Oncology Society (CTOS), Society of Surgical Oncology (SSO), American College of Radiology (ACR) and American Joint Committee on Cancer (AJCC).

Drs. Felasfa Wodajo and Patrick Getty were awarded an AAOS/BOS Quality and Patient Safety grant for their project “Clinical Practice Guidelines for the Medical, Radiation, and Surgical Treatment of Metastatic Carcinoma and Myeloma to the Femur.” This effort is partially funded by the MSTS. We have engaged our medical and radiation oncology colleagues to help create a document that is relevant and recognized by all providers that manage metastatic disease of bone.

Fellowship Committee – Rajiv Rajani, MD, Chair

Welcome from the Fellowship Committee. The committee serves to improve the quality of our trainees pursuing a career in orthopaedic oncology. We also serve to provide oversight and guidance with the match process, the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), while assisting Fellowship Directors as they navigate guidelines. The Fellowship Committee is updating contact information for all MSTs recognized fellowships as we continue to add training programs. Fellowship Directors should contact Dr. Fran Patterson (patterfr@njms.rutgers.edu) for updates after reviewing the information on the MSTs website. The MSTs encourages all fellowships to become MSTs recognized fellowships so that graduates may become MSTs members.

We continue to collect data on case volumes during fellowship. Dr. Dieter Lindskog is compiling a list of surgical procedures that would be used by applicants as a guide to measure clinical volumes during fellowship. We plan to use this data to provide recommendations for programs on appropriate clinical volumes to support fellows and ensure our trainees are qualified to treat patients with musculoskeletal oncologic conditions.

The ACGME is currently reviewing recent modifications to the MSK Oncology Fellowship Program Requirements. Working with Drs. Theodore Parsons and Joel Sorger, updates have been made but require final approval which should occur by mid-2019 after a delay secondary to ACGME changes.

Future work includes a meeting with fellowship directors at the annual meeting so that guidelines can be established. The guidelines will ensure that trainees will be adequately qualified to provide excellent musculoskeletal oncologic care after entering the workforce.

Practice Management Committee – Adam Levin, MD, Incoming Chair

The Practice Management Committee has continued to be active in multiple areas. We have been successful in creating new allograft codes for limb reconstruction, which will take effect January 1, 2019. The AAOS is also working to develop new codes related to nonbioabsorbable antibiotic delivery implants, which is being surveyed together with the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgery (AAHKS).

Some members have reported denials for inpatient stays following the removal of total knee arthroplasty from the inpatient-only designation. This is not the intent or meaning of the change in designation, and it should not be grounds for denial. Please let the Practice Management Committee know in the case of any denials for this reason, so that we can continue working

with the AAOS to address any concerns regarding this matter.

In addition, the committee is working on developing content to be available on the website regarding practice management and coding considerations. This is intended to facilitate and disseminate an understanding of best practices. We welcome any additional pertinent questions and issues related to practice management that may be of interest to the membership for further discussion and presentation. We have also begun to investigate potential opportunities for new CPT codes for local adjuvant therapy and pathologic fracture management. Additional analysis of normative values for orthopaedic oncology productivity is planned as well.

Committee for Registry Development - Ben Miller, MD, Chair

The MSTs registry working group has been collaborating with the AAOS and Epic to progress toward a society-wide sarcoma registry. Six centers (Iowa, Dartmouth, Ohio State, Stanford, Cleveland Clinic, and Johns Hopkins) have volunteered to participate in a pilot project to create the infrastructure that will be the basis of registry expansion to additional centers. We continue to finalize the scientific questions and data elements, create electronic health record forms for automated data collection, and envision the ultimate administrative structure. The AAOS has expressed interest in building a sarcoma registry with us in the near

future, and we are optimistic that we will have some tangible progress by the end of the year. The positive feedback we have received from the AAOS, despite our small numbers and limited direct impact to many orthopaedic surgeons, is due to the continuing engagement and advocacy of the members of our society regarding this important effort. Please continue to emphasize to those in leadership and influential positions how important the sarcoma registry will be to the specialty and our patients.
