

RESEARCH COMMITTEE MEMBER-AT-LARGE

Term:

The member-at-large serves a three (3) year term to begin and expire at the close of the Society's Annual Meeting.

Qualifications:

- 1. Active or Associate MSTS member in good standing.
- 2. Strong research background.
- 3. Interested in providing research mentorship to MSTS members.
- 4. Interested in developing and implementing clinical trial ideas while focusing on building collaborations and infrastructure.

Committee Responsibilities:

- 1. Develops and maintains a competitive, clinically relevant, research program for the advancement of knowledge in musculoskeletal oncology.
- 2. Creates a research funding announcement (RFA) to solicit the membership for research grant applications (administered through the Orthopaedic Research and Education Foundation (OREF)).
- 3. Evaluates research grant applications, offers peer critique, and recommends appropriate funding of a research grant application to the MSTS Executive Committee.
- 4. Monitors related research programs (Clinician Scholar Development Program, Grant Writing Workshop, and Research Capitol Hill Days) and communicate the opportunities to the membership.
- 5. Communicates research project updates to the membership and opportunities for involvement.
- 6. Participates in committee conference calls.
- 7. Conduct other activities as requested by the MSTS Executive Committee.

Meeting Format

Convenes via conference call as needed or called upon by the Research Committee Chair.

Appointment:

Must complete MSTS volunteer application including a biosketch and personal statement explaining why he or she should be appointed to the committee.

Applications are reviewed and selected for appointment by the Executive Committee.
